2020 Amador Quarantine Classic Declaration of Show and/or Sale Instructions for Exhibitors

All exhibitors are required to submit a video and photo showing your Jr. Livestock project(s). These photos and videos will be uploaded on the virtual sale platform for buyers. Additionally, these videos will be used to judge your livestock project for the virtual show. If photo and video is not submitted, you will be unable to show or sell. – **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Submission Instructions Requirements:

All exhibitors will be required to complete a Declaration of Show and/or Sale for each animal to be sold. The Declaration will be available on the Amador County Fair's website under the Fair Info Tab, Exhibitor Info. This Google Form will be available on July 13, 2020 through July 19, 2020 and will give you the ability to upload both your video and photo in one place. Please note a video and photo is required for each animal to be sold. If the declaration isn't completed within this timeframe, exhibitors will be ineligible for the 2020 Amador Quarantine Classic Jr. Livestock Virtual Sale.

Photo Requirements:

Photos must be taken between July 13, 2020 and July 19, 2020. Requirements for photos are:

- 1. Animal must be show ready
- 2. Exhibitor must be in uniform, no hats unless part of uniform
- 3. Take picture horizontally
- 4. Only the exhibitor and animal allowed in photo no other person
- 5. Picture needs to a side view shot of animal (like declaration ring photos see page 2)

Video Requirements:

Videos must be taken between July 13, 2020 and July 19, 2020. Requirements for videos are:

- 1. Animal must be show ready.
- 2. Exhibitor must be in uniform.
- 3. Video must be taken horizontally.
- 4. When filming video, no talking should be heard. There is no coaching from the sidelines allowed.
- 5. Only the exhibitor and the animal are allowed in the video. Only one animal per video.
- 6. The video quality must be good. Ensure your lighting is good and the background does not create a distraction.
- 7. The video must be continuous. There is no cropping, editing, cutting, or pausing of the video.
- 8. The video must be able to show all sides of the animal including:
 - a. Side view
 - b. Front view
 - c. Rear view
 - d. Top view
 - e. Walking
- 9. Videos need to be no longer than 90 seconds.
