#### LOCAL RULES

- **1.** <u>Amador County Fair Liability:</u> Fair Management shall not be responsible for accidents or losses that may occur to any of the exhibitors or participants or exhibits at the show. All persons, exhibiting in or participating in Fair-sponsored activities agree to indemnify from any legal proceeding and hold harmless the State, the County, the Amador County Fair (26th DAA), their officers, agents, employees and volunteers, harmless from any and all claims, liabilities, losses, costs, damages, and attorneys' fees arising out of the willful acts or omissions of the officers, agents, employees, or volunteers of the Fair, including exhibits, exhibitors and/or equipment. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss or damage done to another, or occasioned by or arising from any animal or article exhibited by him/her, and will indemnify the State, the County, the Amador County Fair, their officers, employees, agents and/or volunteers against all legal proceedings thereto. The Amador County Fair assumes no liability or responsibility not herein expressed.
- 2. Premium Dispute: NOVEMBER 15 of each year is the deadline for reporting any error in a premium check or check not having been received by the exhibitor. No changes will be made, or checks issued after this date. Premium checks not cashed after 1 year will be null and void. Premium checks over \$600 will not be mailed until a social security number is provided.

#### LOCAL RULES

- 3. Refunds: Requests for refund of entry fees and added purse money must be in writing to the Fair, and may be granted upon approval of the Board/Fair Management. Refunds may be made only because of sickness, accident, death, cancellation of a class, or return of entries for lack of exhibit space. Non- selected exhibits in a juried show are not eligible for refunds. For animal classes, request must be made prior to the event. Requests involving health or soundness of an animal must be accompanied by a Veterinarian's Certificate and must be received by the Entry Office 24 hours prior to judging
- **4. Protests**: Protests will be considered only if there has been a violation of State or Local Rules that have not been enforced. Decisions of judges, veterinarians, weigh masters, breed callers, tail dock officials and timers cannot be protested and are final.
  - A. No protest will be accepted unless it includes the following information:
    - i. Is filed or received, in writing, with a signed original and a signed duplicate copy
    - ii. Clearly states which rule has been violate
    - iii. States when the protestor first became aware of the facts and rule violation
    - iv. States the facts relied upon for the basis of the protest
    - v. Includes the names of supporting witnesses, with accessible phone numbers
    - vi. Describes or attaches any documents relating to the protest, which must include the written decision issued by the local arbitrating body
    - vii. States that the protestor will cooperate with the investigation of the protest and will be available and agrees to attend any hearing held to resolve the protest at the time and place directed by Fair Management.

#### LOCAL RULES

#### **Protests Continued:**

- B. All Protests must be accompanied by a deposit of \$500.00 (cash, money order or certified check made payable to the fair). NOTE: The deposit will be returned if the protest is upheld. If the protest is upheld, the violator may be held liable for any portion of the direct costs incurred by the fair during the protest resolution. Failure to reimburse the fair shall be cause for disallowing future entries in any of the network of California fairs.
- C. All Protests must be submitted to the Fair Board of Directors at the Fair Office.
- D. Given the short duration of the fair the protestor shall make every effort to file the protest prior to judging. All protests must be filed in writing within 24 hours of the time of the cause of the protest and before conclusion of fair.
- E. The fair will make every effort to resolve protests as quickly as possible. All exhibitors by entering an exhibit and all persons by filing a protest agree to cooperate with Fair Management to resolve protests in a timely manner.
- F. Protests shall be adjudicated by Fair Management and/or members of Board of Directors.
- G. Violations of State Rules may be appealed to State Fairs & Exhibitions Branch (F&E) in writing.
- H. An individual may appeal to F&E only after adjudication at the local level and only if the decision upholds a Local Rule that circumvents or is not in the spirit of a State Rule(s); or the individual can substantiate new and credible information that was not available at the time of the local decision; or there was inappropriate adjudication at the local level that may have included conflict of interest, lack of due process, or a significant misinterpretation of rules.
- F&E must receive the appeal in writing within 24 hours from receipt of notice of local decision.
- J. A hearing may be conducted at the discretion of F&E. The Director of F&E may consult with and/or request that members of State Rules Advisory Committee participate in any hearing.
- K. Once the Director has ruled on an appeal to F&E, no additional protest or appeal will be considered relating to that incident.

#### LOCAL RULES

#### **Protests Continued:**

- L. Any exhibit involved in a filed protest before or during judging is eligible to compete until the protest is resolved and classes that involve a protested exhibit will not become official until the protest is resolved.
- M. In championship or special award classes that involve the protested exhibit the judge shall also select runners-up in case of disqualification.
- N. In the case of protest, the unofficial judging results may be used to prepare the sale list and other information.
- O. At the discretion of fair management, judging can be delayed to allow time for the fair to resolve the protest if to do so does not unreasonably delay or disrupt the operations of the remainder of the fair judging and auction events. Prior to judging the class, fairs may announce that an entry has been protested.
- P. All questions concerning competition or other disputes or differences with staff or the exhibition not provided under the State or Local Rules shall be referred to the fair, whose decision shall be final.
- Q. Disqualification With prior review and approval of an executive committee comprised of Fair Board Members and the Fair Management, the Manager, Superintendent or Department Head of any department shall have the authority, without liability or recourse to the County Amador Fair Board Employees, to bar any exhibitor or his/her representatives in the event of a discourteous act to a Judge or an Official of the Fair, and he or she shall have the power to disqualify the entry of said exhibitor. In the event of such disqualification, the exhibitor forfeits all entry fees, stake fees, stall fees, and all other charges against the exhibitor as well as all prize money that may have been won up to that time.
- R. State Rules Applies for all livestock judging as prescribed by the F&E. These rules are published in a separate book and apply to all entries of this fair and are incorporated herein by reference. These books are available upon request at the Fair Office or on line at: CDFA STATE RULES FOR CALIFORNIA FAIRS.

#### LOCAL RULES

- **5.** <u>All State Health Rules</u>: apply to the Sr. and Jr. Livestock Departments.
- 6. <u>Judging</u>: Exhibitors talking to the judge is prohibited, except when answering a question of the judge. Those who wish to communicate with the judge in regard to their exhibit must do so through the Livestock Superintendent or Clerk and must not interfere with the judge. <u>All Judges' decisions are final</u>. See State Rules for additional information.
- 7. Placings: Where there is only one exhibitor in a class, the first prize, if any merited, will be awarded so far as there are worthy entries. Where entries are not worthy of first prize, judges may, at their discretion, award a prize or prizes of such grade as the animal or entries deserve.
- **8.** Placement of Ribbons: does not guarantee correct placing in judging. Only the official placing on the judging sheet constitutes final placement in classes.
- **9.** Responsibility for Entries: Exhibitor has sole responsibility for proper entry of exhibits.
- 10. Insurance Requirements: Fair does not provide liability coverage for any exhibitor should your animal/exhibit cause bodily injury or property damage. It is strongly recommended that you check with your insurance agent or insurance company to see if your present liability extends to you while participating as an exhibitor at the Amador County Fair. Special events insurance is available through the California Fair Services Authority (CFSA). Contact the Fair office for rates.
- 11. **Residency**: Any exhibitor may be required to prove residency by presenting proof of any one, or combination of the following items if requested by Fair Management: Voter Registration within the designated area, driver's license showing residence address, or a Producer of livestock in normal marketable quantity or commercial quantities, the specific type of animal or product entered within the designated area or property owner. In the event the exhibitor is under 18 years of age, the exhibitor's legal parent(s) or guardian will be responsible for proof of residency.

#### LIVESTOCK RULES

#### LOCAL RULES

- 12. Livestock Parking Passes: Livestock parking includes a trailer and the pull vehicle. Parking in the livestock camping area is limited to two (2) passenger vehicle passes per family. The parking pass must be in vehicle and visible and contained within the marked camping area. Each occupant must pay admission or have a daily pass on their person to be allowed to enter grounds when entering grounds. Vehicles that do not have a valid parking permit will be subject to being towed. Due to the lack of parking in livestock area, all stock trailers will be subject to a \$50 daily parking fee if left in livestock/camping area overnight. Overflow trailer parking is available, or remove all stock trailers if exhibiting more than one day.
- **13. Pets:** No dogs or pets are allowed on fairgrounds except those entered as exhibits and service animals.
- 14. Security: Fair Security will be assigned to the camping, livestock and overflow parking areas. Should an issue arrive, local law enforcement will be notified and fair management reserves the right to expel exhibitor and/or chaperone from the fair and disqualify all exhibitor entries, including the ability to sell at the Jr. Livestock Auction, Replacement Heifer Sale and Agricultural Mechanics Silent Auction.

#### 15. Camping Area Rules & Reservations:

Overnight camping is limited to livestock, horse show, and a limited number of commercial exhibitors only. No reservations will be taken for exhibitors without an entry form. Renewal process for previous years' campsites will be determined by the Fair. Availability of open campsites will be on a first-come, first-served basis in person at the Fair Entry Office. A fee will be charged for each camping space for the duration of Fair. This fee includes one vehicle-parking pass. Sites are Limited to one 15' X 30' space per family. No exceptions on size will be made. A limited number of electrical hook-ups are available; designated spaces only. Electrical hookups are not guaranteed. No loud noise after 11 pm in camping area. Be courteous to your neighbors. NO livestock or horses allowed in camping area. Contact the fair for details, costs, and dates regarding when camping area reservations open.

#### LOCAL RULES

- **16.** <u>Trailer Entry Time</u>: Trailers or campers will not be permitted on the grounds before 8:30 am, Saturday of fair. Only employees of the fair may be allowed early entry.
- 17. Overnight Camping: All Jr Exhibitors camping overnight are required to have a chaperone, over the age of 18, in attendance. It is permissible for one chaperone to be responsible for a maximum of seven (7) Jr. exhibitors. All chaperones will be required to list at the time of purchasing trailer space, the names of the exhibitors they are responsible.
- **18.** Generators: The use of generators may be disallowed if the exhaust is hazardous to the neighboring campsites. ALL generators must have a muffler and the noise level must meet or be below the decibel level of a normal human voice.

#### 19. Electrical Rules:

- ✓ NO modifying of electrical outlets.
- ✓ NO electrical cords across roadways. No exceptions will be made.
- ✓ Extension cords used to distribute power to electrical apparatus shall be rated 15 amps minimum and contain ground wire. Cords not meeting these requirements shall be confiscated for the duration of the fair

#### LIVESTOCK RULES

#### **EXHIBITOR RULES**

#### 20. Exhibitor Eligibility:

- A. Juniors exhibitors must be enrolled in the livestock/small animal project for at least 60 days or 120 days for horses, replacement heifers & market beef immediately preceding the opening day of the fair. Jr. Exhibitors who have not met the enrollment requirements are not eligible to compete in that project. They may also not enter as an Independent exhibitor or under a different organization.
- B. Exhibitors, leaders, and advisors must be in good standing with the local and state organization(s) (4-H, Grange, FFA) to be eligible to exhibit at the Fair. Eligibility of a project per 4-H, FFA, or Grange rules shall be determined by the exhibitor's advisor/leader or designee.
- C. Signatures of advisor, leader, teacher or parent/guardian is required on the entry form by the Fair certifying that:
  - Projects have been under their supervision in accordance with the rules and regulations of the organization and the Fair, and
  - ii. The entry is the project of the exhibitor and is eligible for exhibit. Failure or refusal to sign the required entry form will prevent the exhibitor from entering.
- D. <u>ALL</u> Juniors must have project management records and proof of supervision available as to the length of project. <u>ALL</u> Junior exhibitors must have "on ground" supervision by a responsible adult
- E. <u>FFA</u>: FFA members may participate as exhibitors until the end of the calendar year following the year of graduation from high school and are in good standing with their local and state organization.

#### **EXHIBITOR RULES**

#### **Exhibitor Eligibility continued:**

- F. 4-H: 4-H members belonging to an Amador County Club who are under the supervision of the University of California Cooperative Extension. Primary members may participate as primary in Special Junior Divisions only. Primary Members must be at least 5 years old as of January 1 of the year of the Fair in which they are exhibiting. Primary members may only exhibit small animals (Rabbits, Poultry, Pygmy & Nigerian Goats, and Cavies) in "My Favorite" small animal divisions, as approved by 4-H State Policy. Junior, Intermediate & Senior members must be 9 years old by January 1 of the Fair year that they will be exhibiting to show or sell large animals (horses, cattle, sheep, swine, and llamas). Exhibitors may compete/exhibit through December 31 of the year in which they turn 19 years of age.
- G. GRANGE: Grange members belonging to an Amador County Jr./Youth Grange who are under the supervision of and in good standing with the California State Grange, and reside Amador County are eligible. Jr. Grange members may participate as primary in Special Junior Divisions only. Jr. Grange members must be at least 5 years old on January 1 to exhibit. Jr. Grange members may enter, show cavies, rabbits. poultry (excluding turkeys), Nigerian dwarf and pygmy goats. Youth Grange members must be 9 years old on January 1 of the Fair year that they will be exhibiting to show or sell large animals (horses, cattle, sheep, swine, and llamas). They may exhibit until the end of the calendar year in which they reach age 19. Grange members 12 and under show with 4-H; 13 and over with FFA. Age determined as of livestock entry close date for the current fair year.
- H. INDEPENDENT: Must be residents of Amador County. Jr. Independent exhibitors may participate as primary in Special Junior Divisions only, and must be at least 5 years old on January 1 of the Fair year to exhibit. Jr. Independent exhibitors may enter, show cavies, rabbits, poultry (excluding turkeys), Nigerian dwarf and pygmy goats. Youth Independent exhibitors must be at least 9 years of age by January 1 of the Fair year that they will be exhibiting to show or sell large animals (horses, cattle, sheep, swine, and llamas). They may exhibit until the end of the calendar year in which they reach age 19.

#### LIVESTOCK RULES

#### **EXHIBITOR RULES**

- **21.** Enrollment: Exhibitors who are enrolled in a project in an established junior organization (i.e. 4-H, Grange, FFA), CANNOT also exhibit in Jr. Department Divisions as an "Independent Junior exhibitor" in the same project.
- **22.** <u>Uniforms</u>: All FFA, 4-H & Grange exhibitors of livestock & dairy cattle must wear the established uniform of their organization while showing their animals. Independent exhibitors are required to wear white shirts (long or short sleeves), blue pants, and appropriate footwear (no open toed shoes).

#### 23. Senior Department Restrictions:

Junior exhibitors and Junior organizations may be allowed to enter exhibits in Senior Division classes:

- A. "ALL OTHER" classes are not available,
- B. A class for the exhibit is not provided in the junior divisions,
- C. The class allows participation in featured breed and/or sponsored association shows.
- D. The junior exhibitor must also exhibit the project in the Junior Division(s).
- E. The Junior exhibitor is not eligible to exhibit in the junior divisions should he/she exhibit in the senior divisions that has the same class(es) offered in the junior divisions.
- **24.** <u>Junior Horse Exhibitors</u>: may be allowed to enter the Senior Department horse show unless Local Rules prohibit.

#### **EXHIBITOR RULES**

- 25. Code of Conduct & Ethics: All exhibitors will adhere both their associated to organizational Code of Conduct and Ethics as well as those of the Amador County Fair. Any adults associated with an exhibitor(s), projects or animals will encourage compliance nor allow conduct/rule violations. Expectations include:
  - A. No obscene language
  - B. No tobacco, e-cigarette, or marijuana use
  - C. No drinking of alcoholic beverages by minors as defined by local ordinance and State law(s).
  - D. No use or possession of other illegal substances or products.
  - E. Use of appropriate language and manner towards other people. Abusive/threatening language will not be tolerated.
  - F. Appropriate treatment of animals. Any cruel or abusive treatment toward an animal will not be tolerated.
  - G. Exhibitors shall conduct themselves in a professional manner in the livestock area, including, but not limited to, appropriate dress, physical contact and language.

#### LIVESTOCK RULES

#### PRE-WEIGH/PRE-FAIR RULES

- **26.** <u>Declarations</u>: All market animals must be declared on pre-fair weigh-in date. The Fair must have marked and weighed animals, except rabbits and poultry, on pre-weigh-in dates.
- 27. Rabbit & Poultry Declarations: All Meat Rabbits and Poultry need to declare their animals and receive identification bands at pre-weigh on May 15, 2021. Exhibitors who do not declare and receive identification bands by the May date will not be eligible for sale
- 28. <u>Substitutions</u>: There will be **NO** substitutions of any animal due to death, loss or for any other reason following prefair weigh-ins of large animals and official declarations of intent to exhibit small animals. <u>EXCEPTION</u>: See Replacement Heifer Rules & Information for substitution allowances for project.
- 29. <u>Pre-Weigh</u>: Market Beef is March 21, 2021 and Sheep, Goats, & Swine is May 15, 2021.
- **30.** Pre-Weigh Weight Limitations: There is no maximum weight for beef, sheep or goats. Swine has a maximum pre-weight of 180 lbs. Any swine over 180 lbs. at pre-weigh is automatically disqualified from entering at fair.
- 31. Rate of Gain Requirements: Beef, Sheep, and Swine must show a minimum gain of 20% or meet minimum weight, whichever is greater at the time of Fair weigh-in on July 27, 2021 and meet the Fair's requirements for market classes. Meat Goats must gain a minimum of 1/10 of a pound per day or more between pre-weighin and Fair weigh-in dates. Minimum weights for each species can be found under that species heading.
- **32.** <u>Scrapies</u>: Sheep and/or Goats not having scrapies tags at pre-weigh in will not be allowed across the scales and will not be accepted after scales close.
- **33.** <u>Local Bred Verification Form</u>: All "Local Bred" paperwork due at respective pre-weighin date. NO EXCEPTIONS!

#### PRE-FAIR/PRE-WEIGH RULES

- 34. Independent Junior **Exhibitors:** Replacement Heifer exhibitors will submit declaration of intent and proof of quality assurance no later than March 20, 2021 (120 days prior to fair). Market Beef exhibitors and Horse exhibitors must submit declaration of intent, proof of current quality assurance, and horse ownership/leases no later than March 29, 2021 (120 days prior to Exhibitors showing other market species will submit declaration of intent and proof of quality assurance no later than May 15, 2021 (60 days prior to Fair). All other breeder, feeder animals and rabbits and poultry will submit declaration of intent and proof of quality assurance no later than **June 11, 2020**. All Independent Exhibitors must submit proof of insurance by close of entries for their species.
- **35.** <u>Insurance</u> <u>Requirements</u>: Independent Exhibitors shall provide insurance coverage as required by the Fair. Special events insurance is available through the California Fair Services Authority (CFSA). Contact the Fair office for rates. Other Livestock & Horse Exhibitors; the Amador County Fair does not provide liability coverage for any exhibitor should an animal/exhibit cause bodily injury property damage. It is strongly recommended that an exhibitor check with their insurance company to see if present liability extends to the exhibitor while participating as an exhibitor at the Amador County Fair. Special events insurance is available through the California Fair Services Authority (CFSA). Contact the Fair office for rates.
- **36.** <u>Waivers</u>: "Release & Waiver of Liability Agreement" is inferred upon submittal of fair entries by an exhibitor or legal guardian. This includes all methods of entry.
- **37.** <u>Animal Ethics:</u> All Junior Livestock Exhibitors need to have a valid & current Quality Assurance Certificate on file at the Fair Office. <a href="http://yqca.org/">http://yqca.org/</a>. Certificates shall be submitted to the fair office no later than the date fair entries close.

#### LIVESTOCK RULES

#### 38. SCRAPIES REQUIREMENTS GOATS & SHEEP:

- A. All sheep and goats entering fairs require individual identification. All official ID will be kept on the animals. The official ID may be official USDA individual ID ear tags, premises ear tags, Scrapie Flock Certification Program ear tags, registration tattoos, if accompanied by registration papers, or other methods approved by the CA Department of Food & Ag.
- B. All sheep and goats from out of state require official individual identification, a certificate of veterinary inspection and a California entry permit.
- C. Fairs will not accept sheep and goats from scrapie "non-compliant" flocks, or animals that are scrapie-positive or scrapie suspects.
- D. Fairs will not accept sheep and goats from scrapie-infected or source flocks, or animals that have been exposed to scrapies unless they have been evaluated and approved for exhibition by the State scrapie epidemiologist.
- E. Fairs will keep records of the consignor, buyer, and animal identification for five (5) years when animals change ownership at the fair.
- F. Fairs will try to accommodate Scrapie Flock Certification Program members with separate space, if practical. Breeding animals should be housed in separate enclosures or locations from animals that aren't in the certification program, if practical.
- G. Sheep or goats within 30 days pre- or postparturition, or with vaginal discharge, shall if practical, be kept separate from animals from different flocks and in an area, that can be properly cleaned and disinfected.
- H. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to acquire scrapie identification before fair.
- Sheep and/or Goats not having scrapies tags at pre-weigh in will not be allowed across the scales and will not be accepted after scales close.

#### FAIR/EXHIBITING RULES

- **39.** <u>Stall Assignments</u>: Stalls and pens assignments will not be made until club/chapter leaders/advisors review and verify all entries. The fair will have stall assignments posted by Monday afternoon the week of fair.
- 40. Liability for Stall Damages: Charge for damage to any stalls, which includes removal of stall boards, will be billed to the exhibitor. Failure to make payment shall prohibit the exhibitor or his/her horses or his/her livestock from making future entries at the Amador County Fair. In the event the exhibitor has won premium awards, replacement costs will be deducted from said premiums. Payment to exhibitor from Jr. Livestock Auction or Replacement Heifer Sale may be withheld until reimbursement to the fair is made.
- **41.** <u>Jr. Livestock in Place:</u> No livestock will be allowed on the grounds prior to 7 am, Tuesday of fair. Swine projects are required to be in place no later than 11:00 am. All other jr. livestock in place by 3:00 pm.
- **42.** <u>Sr. Livestock in Place</u> Sr. Livestock is required to be in place Wednesday of fair. See Livestock Schedule for time(s).
- **43. Vet Check:** Vet Check is required for all animals entering the fairgrounds. Vet Check for Jr. Livestock exhibitors is Tuesday, of fair upon arrival. Vet check card will be needed for weigh in. Vet check for Sr. Livestock is also required. See Livestock Schedule for times.
- 44. Fair Weigh-In: Animals will be weighed in after arrival at the fairgrounds. There will be one weigh-in only. If the animal does not make weight, the animal will be taken off the scale, the scale balanced and the animal immediately reweighed upon request. See Livestock Schedule for times and date of Fair Weigh-In. All market beef exhibitors must have brand inspection documents, vet check form, and medication verification form available at weigh-in. All other livestock must provide vet check form and medication verification form at weigh-in.
- 45. Weight Maximums & Sale Weights:
  Swine exceeding 285 lbs. at fair weigh-in will be disqualified for show and sale. Exhibitors will not receive any payment for weights that exceed: Sheep 155 lbs., Market Steers 1300 lbs.; Market Heifers 1200 lbs.; Goats 105 lbs.

#### LIVESTOCK RULES

#### FAIR/EXHIBITING RULES

**46.** <u>Medications</u>: Animals must be withheld from the Jr. Livestock Auction if any medications have been administered to those animals other than in accordance with label instructions. Animals may be withheld from the sale for health reasons at the discretion of the Fair.

#### 47. Class Placings for Animals:

All Jr. Livestock projects must meet the specified weight and classification given in the list for the respective divisions. The Livestock Superintendent will determine the class breaks

- **48.** for all Jr. Livestock classes.

  <u>Judging Schedules</u>: It will be each exhibitor's responsibility to follow the progress of judging schedules & to be prepared and ready to enter the judging ring promptly when classes are called. Exhibitors having more than one animal to show must arrange to exchange animals without delay. <u>Classes will not be held for late</u> exhibitors. All animals entered in groups must
- **49.** be of one breed. **Appearance of Exhibitor & Animal:** The exhibitor shall wear approved uniform with closed toe shoes in the ring. Independent Exhibitors shall wear a white collared shirt and dark pants/jeans. Animals shall enter the show ring in show ring form. Only show products allowable by Fair Management may be used on
- 50. the animals.
  <u>Declaration Pictures:</u> Seller must submit declaration photo with any potential sale animal(s) prior to fair. Exhibitor must be in
  51. approved uniform when taking picture.
  - Sale Declaration: Exhibitor MUST make a declaration of intent to sell for ALL sale animals NO LATER THAN one (1) hour after the end of the last Junior Livestock Market Show on Friday. Replacement Heifers, Declaration of Intent to Sell must be made within 10 minutes of end of Replacement Heifer show. Failure to declare will result in a penalty of \$75.00 per animal for reinstatement into the sale order. For Replacement Heifers, any fees must be paid by Friday, prior to the sale. For market animals, the fee must be paid by noon, Saturday prior to Sale. No declaration or payment will be accepted after Saturday noon.

#### FAIR/EXHIBITING RULES

- **52.** Excess Declarations: Excess declarations made by a seller will be corrected at the discretion of the Fair.
- **53. Jr. Livestock Auction Sale Order:** Sale order will be posted in the livestock barns Friday after the last market show. Exhibitors are responsible for checking the sale order for any mistakes and must notify the fair prior to noon on Saturday or no changes to the sale order will be made. The Fair reserves the right to arrange the sale order in the way they consider equitable to all sellers.
- 54. Responsibility for Project Care: All Jr. Livestock Exhibitors are responsible for care of their own animals, including feeding, pen cleaning, grooming and/or shearing. Assistance and/or instruction may be offered ONLY by other Amador County Fair junior exhibitors, and while the exhibitor is present. Adults may offer ONLY verbal assistance and/or instruction. Any exception must be approved by the Livestock Superintendent.
- **55.** Exhibitors will be expected to keep stalls clean: and aisles swept down. All manure and debris must be removed to outside of the barns daily. Removal time shall be prior to 8:00 A.M. and after 5:00 P.M. each day. Please do not remove debris at times other than allotted. Trash containers are located throughout the barns to use for paper, cans, etc. We encourage the use of these containers in the effort to keep our barns as clean as possible. ALWAYS RECYCLE WHEN POSSIBLE.
- **56.** "For Sale" Signage: No signage is permitted or placed upon any exhibit or in any building of the Amador County Fair. There is no objection to private sales, but in case a sale is made, no sign announcing the sale may be placed in or upon any building.
- 57. Sunday "Move Out": No stall/display tear downs or equipment removal is allowed until after 6:00 pm on Sunday. This is to allow the Livestock Transport the ability to load out auction animals and ensure animal safety and safety of livestock staff and volunteers. Leaders and Advisors are expected to enforce this rule. Any vehicles that inhibit/block alleyway areas or otherwise impede necessary roadways will be towed at the owner's expense. Sr./Open Livestock may haul out prior to Sunday morning with a Livestock Release. No open livestock will be released on Sunday until after 6:00 pm.

# THE AMADOR COUNTY FAIR Jr. LIVESTOCK AUCTION IS A TERMINAL SALE NO EXCEPTIONS

**58.** Eligibility for Auction: The Amador County Fair Jr. Livestock Auction is limited to Amador County 4-H Clubs, FFA Chapters, Youth Granges & Independent exhibitors attending schools or living in Amador County meeting the Junior Department State Rules for California Fairs exhibitor requirements.

#### 59. Sale Eligibility/Requirements:

- A. <u>Large Animals (Beef, Sheep, Goats)</u> ALL eligible champions and reserve champions and "sale champions" and "sale reserve champions" are required to sell. Should the Champion or Reserve Champion become ineligible to sell, the judge will choose a "Sale Champion" and "Reserve Champion".
  - Only Beef, Swine, Sheep, and Meat Goats graded as Marketable One (1) or Marketable Two (2) will be allowed to sell in the auction.
  - ii. Sellers may sell only one (1) <u>large</u> <u>animal (Beef, Swine, Sheep, & Meat Goat)</u> <u>subject</u> to the following <u>exceptions:</u>
  - iii. If Seller has more than one Marketable Plus) Swine, Sheep, or Meat Goat, seller may sell a maximum of two large animals.
  - iv. If Seller has a Marketable Plus or Marketable Beef AND a Marketable Plus Swine, Sheep or Meat Goat, seller may sell Beef and one other Marketable Plus animal.
  - v. If Seller has two or more Champion or Reserve Champion large animals, all Champions and Sale Champions will sell, but seller may not sell any other marketable large animals.
- B. Small Animals (Rabbits, Poultry & Turkeys) ONLY eligible champions and reserve champions and "sale champions" and "sale reserve champions" are required to sell. Should the Champion or Reserve Champion become ineligible to sell, the judge will choose a "Sale Champion" and "Reserve Champion".

#### JR. LIVESTOCK AUCTION RULES

- 60. Conditions of Jr. Livestock

  Auction: Livestock sold in the Auction
  must be exhibited in one of the market
  classes of beef, sheep, swine, meat goat,
  rabbit, turkey or poultry in the current
  year's Amador County Fair.
- 61. Personal Information: No personal information regarding the exhibitor or the livestock project can be given to the auctioneers to announce during the auction. Any exceptions to this rule will be pre-approved by fair management prior to the auction.
- **62.** <u>Sale Order</u>: Exhibitor is responsible for bringing own animal into sale ring in accordance with the sale order and then to a designated location. Any exceptions must be pre-approved by fair management.
- 63. Appearance of Exhibitor & Animal: The exhibitor shall wear approved uniform with closed toe shoes in the ring. Independent Exhibitors shall wear a white collared shirt and dark pants/jeans. Animals shall enter the sale ring in show ring form. Only show products allowable by Fair Management may be used on the animals in the sale ring (i.e. no glitter, etc.)
- 64. Risk: All animals sold is at the buyer's risk.
- **65.** <u>Sale of Animal</u>: Each animal will be sold to the highest bidder without reserve. The auctioneer will settle any disputes as to bids by declaring all bids off and reselling the animal in question. Bidding procedure will accept buying orders as allowable bids. Animal may be sold one (1) time *only*.
- **66.** Care of Animals after Sale: All animals will be cared for, free of charge and without responsibility to the buyer, until shipped. Swine exhibitors are required to ensure feed and water are available to animals sold until the transport truck arrives Monday after fair.

#### LIVESTOCK RULES

#### JR. LIVESTOCK AUCTION RULES

- 67. Transportation: All animals sold at this auction will be transported to a USDA approved processing facility contracted with by the Amador County Fair. The Fair will provide transportation. The split carcass (except for the resale animals) will be returned to the processing plant of the purchaser's choice within Amador County. Animals consigned for sale and sold through the auction are not eligible for re-purchase.
- **68. Private Treaty:** Contingent upon space availability in transport vehicles, Private Treaty Sale Animals will be accepted for processing on a first come, first served basis. Prior to being accepted on the wait list for processing, written verification of sale on Fair Forms must be completed and submitted to the Fair's Administration Office with payment of appropriate fees by end of the Junior Livestock Auction. Only animals eligible for sale through the auction are allowed to be sold through the Fair Private Treaty and placed on the livestock transport (no "feeders" or "fatties").
- 69. Disbursements to Jr. Livestock Exhibitors: Disbursements for all fair JLA Exhibitors (sellers) will be distributed at the time the Amador County Fair has received enough monies to fund all exhibitor (seller) payments, or within 90 days of the auction, whichever occurs first. This applies to Jr. Livestock Auction, Replacement Heifer sale and Ag Mechanics Auction. Sellers will be paid by check. A commission of seven percent (7%) of the gross selling price will be deducted to defray auction sale expenses and provide improvements to the Junior Livestock Program. Any legally mandated inspection/marketing fees will also be deducted.
- 70. Agricultural Mechanics Silent Auction: All exhibits eligible to sell through the silent auction will be in place by 9:00 am on Sunday at the designated area. Minimum bids will be set by the exhibitor with increments of \$20. Bids will be taken until 1:30 pm. Exhibits will sell to the highest bidder and are subject to all Junior Livestock Auction Rules.

Birds will be judged in the proper division and class for breed, variety, age and sex only. If no class is offered no award may be made. <u>ALL ENTRIES ARE FINAL - NO SUBSTITUTIONS.</u> Disqualified birds and those absent at the time of judging do not count when computing the number of exhibitors in the section. A judge may excuse a bird from competition if it appears to be fatigued or out of condition, but the bird shall be counted as an entry. For all classes of Standard bred chickens, all birds must be identified by leg bands conforming to the entry form on arrival at the show.

**HEALTH RULES:** Refer to State Rules and scorecards for California Fairs. Any bird showing evidence of disease will be immediately removed from the fairgrounds. HEALTH INSPECTION REQUIRED UPON ARRIVAL. (SEE SCHEDULE) ANY VIOLATION OF STATE OR LOCAL RULES WILL RESULT IN LOSS OF ANY AWARDS. STATE RULES APPLY.
