THIS IS A <u>TERMINAL</u> SALE OF ALL ANIMALS SOLD THROUGH THE AUCTION. NO EXCEPTIONS

Limited to Amador County 4-H Clubs, FFA Chapters, Youth Granges & Independent exhibitors attending schools or living in Amador County meeting the Junior Department State Rules for California Fairs exhibitor requirements.

LARGE ANIMALS

BEEF, SWINE, SHEEP & MEAT GOATS

ALL ELIGIBLE CHAMPIONS AND RESERVE CHAMPIONS AND "SALE CHAMPION" AND "SALE RESERVE CHAMPION" ARE REQUIRED TO SELL. If the exhibitor of the Champion or Reserve Champion is not eligible to sell, the judge will choose a "Sale Champion". Only Beef, Swine, Sheep, and Meat Goats graded as Marketable One (1) or Marketable Two (2) will be allowed to sell in the auction.

Sellers may sell only one (1) large animal (Beef, Swine, Sheep, & Meat Goat) subject to the following exceptions:

- ~If Seller has more than one Marketable One (1) Swine, Sheep, or Meat Goat, seller may sell a maximum of two large animals.
- ~If Seller has a Marketable One (1) or Marketable Two (2) Beef **AND** a Marketable One (1) Swine, Sheep or Meat Goat, seller may sell Beef and one other Marketable One (1) animal.
- ~If Seller has two or more Champion or Reserve Champion large animals, all Champions and Sale Champions will sell, but seller may not sell any other Marketable large animals.

SMALL ANIMALS

RABBITS, POULTRY & TURKEYS

Only Champion & Reserve Champion AND "SALE CHAMPION" AND "SALE RESERVE CHAMPION" small animals (Rabbits, Poultry, and Turkeys) will sell.

The Amador County Fair Junior Livestock Auction is subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Livestock sold in the Auction must be exhibited in one of the market classes of beef, sheep, swine, meat goat, rabbit, turkey or poultry in the current year's Amador County Fair.
- 2. No personal information about the seller will be given out by the auctioneers during the auction.
- **3.** All market animals must be declared on pre- fair weigh-in date. The Fair must have marked and weighed animals, except rabbits and poultry, on pre-weigh-in days. 4-H & Grange leaders, FFA advisors, and Independent exhibitor's parent or guardian will submit to the Amador County Fair the names of exhibitors owning fryer rabbits, meat pen rabbits, and poultry and the identification numbers of their rabbits and poultry by May 18, 2019. Rabbits & poultry whose identification numbers have not been received by this date will not be eligible for sale.
- **4.** There will be **NO** substitutions of any animal due to death, loss or for any other reason following pre-fair weigh-ins of large animals and official declarations of intent to exhibit small animals.
- **5.** At pre weigh-in for **Beef** on **March 24, 2019** and Sheep, & Goats on **May 18, 2019**. There is no maximum weight. Swine have a maximum pre weight of 175 lbs. **All Market animals** (Beef, Sheep, Swine) must show a minimum gain of 20% (or meet minimum weight whichever is greater) at the time of Fair weigh-in on **Tuesday, July 23, 2019** and meet the Fair's requirements for market classes. Meat Goats must gain a minimum of 1/10 of a pound per day or more between pre-weigh-in and Fair weigh-in. Sheep and/or Goats not having scrapies tags at pre-weigh in will not be allowed across the scales and will not be accepted after scales close.
- **6.** Animals must meet the specified weight and classification given in the premium list for the particular divisions. Animals will be weighed in after arrival at the fairgrounds. There will be one weigh-in only. If the animal does not make weight, the animal will be taken off the scale, the scale balanced and the animal immediately re-weighed upon request. Sellers do not receive any payment for any weight that exceeds: 270 lbs. hogs; 150 lbs. sheep; 1300 lbs. beef steers and 1050 lbs. beef heifers; 105 lbs. goats. Swine exceeding 270 lbs. will be disqualified and may leave the fairgrounds on completion of weigh-in.
- 7. All market beef exhibitors must have brand inspection documents available at weigh-in on Tuesday, July 23, 2019.
- **8.** Seller must have photo taken with their sale animal at the designated area immediately following that species' market show. **Seller may declare at this time.**
- **9.** SELLER MUST make a declaration of intent to sell for ALL sale animals NO LATER THAN one (1) hour after the end of the last Junior Market Show. Replacement Heifers, declaration of intent to sell must be made within 10 minutes of end of heifer show.

Failure to declare will result in a penalty of \$75.00 per animal for reinstatement into the sale order. For Replacement Heifers, the fee must be paid by Friday, prior to the sale. For market animals, the fee must be paid by noon, Saturday prior to Sale. No declaration or payment will be accepted after Saturday noon.

- 10. Excess declarations made by a seller will be corrected at the discretion of the Fair.
- **11.** Animals must be withheld from sale if any medications have been administered to those animals other than in accordance with label instructions.
- 12. Animals may be withheld from the sale for health reasons at the discretion of the Fair.

- 13. Sale order will be posted in the livestock barns Friday after the last market show. The Fair reserves the right to arrange the sale order in the manner in which they consider equitable to all sellers.
- 14. Seller is responsible for bringing own animal into sale ring in accordance with the sale order and then to a designated location.
- **15.** Each animal will be sold to the highest bidder without reserve. The auctioneer will settle any disputes as to bids by declaring all bids off and reselling the animal in question. Bidding procedure will accept buying orders as allowable bids.

16. <u>AMADOR COUNTY FAIR JUNIOR. LIVESTOCK AUCTION POLICY, EFFECTIVE 2018:</u> Amador County Fair Junior Livestock Auction Exhibitor (Seller) Policy

1. Amador County Fair Junior Livestock Auction (JLA) disbursements for all fair JLA Exhibitor (seller) will be distributed at the time the Amador County Fair has received enough monies to fund all exhibitor (seller) payments, or within 90 days of the auction, whichever occurs first.

Amador County Fair Junior Livestock Auction Buyer Policy

- All buyers are required to provide credit card information or guarantee of payment (signed check) prior to receiving a buyer's number. <u>EXCEPTIONS MUST BE APPROVED IN ADVANCE BY AMADOR COUNTY FAIR</u> BOARD OF DIRECTORS OR ITS DESIGNEE.
- 2. All buyers at the Amador County Junior Livestock Auction (JLA) must have received a buyer's number and provided required contact and payment information prior to purchasing an animal. Any lot sold to a buyer without a buyer's number will be considered a "no sale" and will be sold immediately.
- 3. All buyers are expected to pay for their purchases on the day of the Auction. Cash, Check, Visa, MasterCard, Discover and American Express are accepted forms of payment. An additional fee of \$35 shall be assessed on all insufficient fund checks and/or transaction fees resulting from a declined check or credit card transaction.
- 4. Should the JLA lot not be paid the day of the sale, the payment guarantee will be utilized for any outstanding balances after 30 days of the auction. It is the responsibility of the buyer to ensure all outstanding balances are paid within 30 days of auction.
- 5. At 30 days, any outstanding balances and fees will accrue a twenty (20%) percent penalty, compounded monthly, until the balance is paid in full.
- 6. The Amador County Fair JLA reserves the right to refuse to issue a buyer's number to any potential buyer due to their prior non-payment or poor payment history.

Amador County JLA exhibitors (sellers) will not receive payment until enough monies are received to distribute all exhibitor (seller) checks.

- **17. THIS IS A TERMINAL SALE.** ALL ANIMALS sold at this auction will be transported to the USDA approved processing facility contracted with by the Amador County Fair. The Fair will provide transportation. The split carcass (with the exception of the resale animals) will be returned to the processing plant of the purchaser's choice within Amador County. Animals consigned for sale and sold through the auction are not eligible for re-purchase.
- **18.** All animals large and small will be at purchaser's risk as sold and will be delivered to trucker for shipment at the completion of the sale.
- 19. All animals will be cared for, free of charge and without responsibility to the buyer, until shipped.
- **20.** Sellers will be paid by check. A commission of seven percent (7%) of the gross selling price will be deducted to defray auction sale expenses and provide improvements to the Junior Livestock Program. Any legally mandated inspection/marketing fees will also be deducted.
- **21.** Animals may be sold one (1) time *only*.
- **22.** The animals shall enter the sale ring in show ring form. Only show products allowable by Fair may be used on the animals in the sale ring (i.e. no glitter, etc.)
- **23.** Contingent upon space availability in transport vehicles, **Private Treaty Sale Animals** will be accepted for processing on a first come, first served basis. Prior to being accepted on the wait list for processing, written verification of sale on Fair Forms must be completed and submitted to the Fair's Administration Office with payment of appropriate fees by end of the Junior Livestock Auction.

- $\textbf{1.} \ \underline{\textbf{All}} \ \ \underline{\textbf{State}} \ \ \underline{\textbf{and}} \ \ \underline{\textbf{Health}} \ \ \underline{\textbf{Rules}} \ \ \text{apply to the Sr. and Jr.}$ Departments.
- **2. Quality Assurance Certificates,** as of 2019, must be completed annually by every junior exhibitor an on file at the Fair Office. Current certificates to be turned in at exhibitor's respective pre-weigh date, March 23, 24 or May 18, 2019.
- **3.** <u>Animals</u> affected by or having been exposed to any contagious diseases, during the thirty days preceding the Fair will be excluded from the grounds. In case of any outbreak of contagious or infectious diseases among the domestic animals, neither the Amador County Fair Board nor employees will be liable for any damage or loss to exhibitors.
- **4.** <u>Stall Assignments</u> Stalls and pens assignments will not be made until club/chapter leaders/advisors review and verify all entries. Assignments will be posted Monday July 22nd afternoon.
- **5.** <u>Liability for Stall Damages</u> Charge for damage to any stalls, which includes removal of stall boards, will be billed to the exhibitor. Failure to make payment shall prohibit the exhibitor or his/her horses and/or livestock from entering in any future Amador County Fair. If the exhibitor has won premium awards, replacement costs will be deducted from said premiums.
- **6.** Exhibitors will be expected to keep stalls clean and aisles swept down. All manure and debris must be removed to outside of the barns daily. Removal time shall be prior to 7:30 A.M. and after 5:00 P.M. each day. Please do not remove debris at times other than allotted. Trash containers are located throughout the barns to use for paper, cans, etc. We encourage the use of these containers in the effort to keep our barns as clean as possible. **~NEW~** The pen/stall fee of \$5.00 has be reinstated for all exhibitors as of 2019.

ALWAYS RECYCLE WHEN POSSIBLE.

- **7. No livestock** will be allowed on the grounds prior to Tuesday, July 23rd at 7:00 am
- **8.** <u>Judging Schedules:</u> It will be each exhibitor's responsibility to follow the progress of judging schedules & to be prepared and ready to enter the judging ring promptly when classes are called. <u>Exhibitors having more than one animal to show must arrange to exchange animals without delay.</u> Classes will not be held for late exhibitors. All animals entered in groups must be of one breed.
- **9.** No "For Sale" signs will be permitted or placed upon any exhibit or barn/building during the Amador County Fair. There is no objection to private sales, but in case a sale is made, no sign announcing the sale may be placed in or upon any barn/building.

 10. Dogs Or Pets are not allowed on fairgrounds except those
- 10. <u>Dogs Or Pets</u> are <u>not</u> allowed on fairgrounds except thos entered in Fair as exhibits or are identified service animals.
- 11. <u>Junior Livestock Exhibitors</u> are responsible for care of their own animals, which includes feeding, pen cleaning, grooming and/or shearing. Assistance and/or instruction may be offered <u>ONLY</u> by other Amador County Fair <u>junior</u> exhibitors, and while the exhibitor of the animal is present. Adults may offer <u>ONLY</u> verbal assistance and/or instruction. Any exception must be approved by the Livestock Superintendent.
- **12.** <u>Waivers:</u> All exhibitors are required to sign a "Release & Waiver of Liability Agreement" to exhibit in the Livestock & Horse shows. Exhibitors under the age of 18 years also require a parent or guardian signature.
- 13. Insurance Requirements: As an exhibitor there is NO liability coverage provided on your behalf by the Amador County Fair, should your animal/exhibit cause bodily injury or property damage. It is strongly recommended that you check with your insurance agent or insurance company to see if your present liability extends to you while participating as an exhibitor at the Amador County Fair. California Fair Services Authority (CFSA). offers event insurance. Contact the Fair for rates.
- **14.** <u>Independent Exhibitors</u> shall provide insurance coverage as required by the Fair. CFSA offers event insurance. Contact the Fair for rates.

- 15. <u>Declarations:</u> Beef and Horse declarations and local bred forms are due by March 24, 2019. (120 days prior to Fair). Horse Leases must be submitted by March 24, 2019 as well. All other Livestock declarations local bred forms must be made by May 18, 2019 (60 days prior to Fair) at the conclusion of preweigh-in
- **16.** <u>Compliance:</u> Failure to comply with all exhibitor, junior livestock and state rules may result in the disqualification of the exhibitor with loss to any & all premiums.
- 17. Pre-Weigh in: Replacement Heifer Preg Check on March 23, 2019; Beef on March 24, 2019; Sheep, Swine, Goats, Poultry & Rabbits on May 18, 2019. Swine maximum pre-weigh-in weight cannot exceed 175 lbs. There is no maximum weight for other species. All Market animals, (Beef, Sheep, Swine), must show a minimum gain of 20% over the pre-weigh weight at the time of Fair Weigh In, Tuesday, July 23rd and meet the Fair's requirements for market classes. Meat Goats must gain a minimum of 1/10 of a pound per day or more between pre-weigh-in and Fair weigh-in.
- **18.** <u>Livestock</u> is not allowed outside of the barn area, including the camping area at any time for any reason!
- **19. Vet check:** Will be required for all animals entered by a Junior Exhibitor upon entering the fairgrounds on Tuesday, July $23^{\rm rd}$ and a vet check card will be needed for weigh in. Vet check is from 7:00 am 3:00 pm.
- **20.** Medication Release Forms shall be completed & turned in during weigh in at Fair.
- **21.** <u>Local Bred Animals:</u> All exhibitors will submit completed "Local Bred" paperwork at pre-weigh-in. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

SCRAPIE REQUIREMENTS FOR GOATS & SHEEP

- 1. All sheep and goats entering fairs require individual identification. All official ID will be kept on the animals. The official ID may be official USDA individual ID ear tags, premises ear tags, Scrapie Flock Certification Program ear tags, registration tattoos, if accompanied by registration papers, or other methods approved by the CA Department of Food & Ag.
- **2.** All sheep and goats from out of state require official individual identification, a certificate of veterinary inspection and a California entry permit.
- **3.** Fairs will not accept sheep and goats from scrapie "non-compliant" flocks, or animals that are scrapie-positive or scrapie suspect.
- **4.** Fairs will not accept sheep and goats from scrapie-infected or source flocks, or animals that have been exposed to scrapies unless they have been evaluated and approved for exhibition by the State scrapie epidemiologist.
- **5.** Fairs will keep records of the consignor, buyer, and animal identification for five (5) years when animals change ownership at the fair.
- **6.** Fairs will try to accommodate Scrapie Flock Certification Program members with separate space, if practical. Breeding animals should be housed in separate enclosures or locations from animals that aren't in the certification program, if practical.
- **7.** Sheep or goats within 30 days pre- or post-parturition, or with vaginal discharge, shall if practical, be kept separate from animals from different flocks and in an area that can be properly cleaned and disinfected.
- **8.** It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to acquire scrapie identification before fair.
- Sheep and/or Goats not having scrapies tags at pre-weigh in will not be allowed across the scales and will not be accepted after scales close.

EXHIBITOR RULES

- 1. <u>FFA MEMBERS AGE REQUIREMENTS</u>: May participate as members until the end of the calendar year following the year of graduation from high school. (for example, graduates this year are eligible until December 31 of 2018), and are in good standing with their local and state organization.
- 2. 4-H AGE REQUIREMENTS: Amador County Club members only who are under the supervision of the University of California Cooperative Extension. Primary members may participate as primary in Special Junior Divisions only. Primary Members must be at least 5 years old or in Kindergarten as of January 1 of the year of the Fair in which they are exhibiting. Primary members may only exhibit small animals (Rabbits, Poultry, Pygmy & Nigerian Goats, and Cavies) in "My Favorite" small animal divisions, as approved by 4-H State Policy. Intermediate & Senior members must be 9 years old or in the 4th Grade by January 1 of the Fair year in which they will be exhibiting. Exhibitors may compete/exhibit through December 31 of the year in which they turn 19 vears of age.
- 3. <u>GRANGE</u>: Amador County Grange members who are under the supervision of the California State Grange, and are residents of Amador County are eligible. Youth members may participate as primary in Special Junior Divisions only. Grange members must be at least 5 years old on January 1 to exhibit. Youth members may enter, show and have judged, cavies, rabbits, poultry (excluding turkeys), Nigerian dwarf and pygmy goats. Must be 9 years old on January 1 to exhibit large animals (horses, cattle, sheep, swine, and llamas). They may exhibit until the end of the calendar year in which they reach age 19. Grange members 12 and under show with 4-H; 13 and over with FFA. Age determined as of the first day of the Junior Livestock Judging.
- 4. <u>INDEPENDENT EXHIBITOR</u>: Must be residents of Amador County and at least 9 years of age or in the 4th Grade by January 1. Exhibitors are eligible to compete/exhibit through December 31 of the year in which they turn 19 years of age.
- 5. <u>OPEN YOUTH</u>: Primary members may participate as primary in Special Junior Divisions only. Under 9 years of age must exhibit in special divisions designated by the Fair. For junior exhibitors showing in divisions and classes other than 4-H, FFA, and Grange, the local Fair management may set requirements as to age, grade, etc. If not printed, Independent age rule will apply. Exhibitors will be placed/penned within their age appropriate classes/barn. Primary members may participate as primary in Special Junior Divisions only. Youth ages 5 through 8 years of age as of January 1, may participate as primary members/exhibitors in Special Junior Divisions only. Uniforms requested are blue pants and white long or short-sleeved shirt, no hat/cap and appropriate footwear (no open toe shoes).
- 6. <u>OPEN JUNIOR</u>: If an open junior class is not available, junior exhibitors may enter an appropriate FFA/Grange (13+), or 4-H/Grange (12 and under) class if they meet all appropriate age and State Rule requirements. <u>Age to be determined as of the first day of Fair</u>.
- 7. <u>ENROLLMENT</u>: Jr. exhibitors who are enrolled in a project, in an established junior organization (i.e. 4-H, Grange, FFA), CANNOT also exhibit in Jr. Department Divisions as an "Independent Junior exhibitor" in the same project.

- 8. <u>ENTRY GUIDE LINES</u>: Any school project must be entered in the Open Junior Divisions. Entries shall be made on Jr. Department entry forms provided by the Fair. 4-H, Grange, FFA & Industrial Ed, entry forms must be signed by a Leader or Instructor and parent. Independent Junior exhibitors must have a parent signature on entry form. State & Local Rules apply to all entries and score cards in corresponding Jr. Department classes & shall be used unless otherwise provided in these divisions.
- 9. ELIGIBILITY: Juniors must own and/or grow or construct their exhibits. 4-H, FFA, and Grange animal and poultry project members must be enrolled in the project for at least 60 days (120 days for horses & market beef) immediately preceding the opening day of the fair. Juniors who have been 4-H, FFA, or Grange project members within 60 days (120 days for horse and market beef) prior to the fair are not eligible to compete in that project as Independent Juniors or enter project(s) under a different organization. Exhibitors, leaders, and advisors must be in good standing with the local and state organization(s) (4-H, Grange, FFA) to be eligible to exhibit at the Fair. Eligibility of a project according to 4-H, FFA, or Grange rules shall be determined by the exhibitor's advisor/leader or designee. Signatures of advisor, leader, teacher or parent/guardian is required on the entry form by the Fair certifying that: (a) Projects have been under their supervision in accordance with the rules and regulations of the organization and the Fair, and (b) The entry is the project of the exhibitor and is eligible for exhibit. Failure or refusal to sign the required entry form will prevent the exhibitor from entering that particular class(es). Independent exhibitors must enter an Open Junior or Independent class unless one is not available. If an Open or Independent class is not available, Junior exhibitors may enter an appropriate 4-H, FFA, or Grange class. Divisions and/or class placement of Independents may be determined by Fair management. ALL Juniors must have project management records and proof of supervision available as to the length of project. ALL Junior exhibitors must have "on ground" supervision by a responsible adult.
- 10. <u>INDEPENDENT</u> <u>DECLARATION</u> <u>TIMELINE</u>: Independent Juniors entering market animals must provide Fair management with a picture of their animal, permanent tag and/or tattoo information, and the appropriate packet (available at the Fair Office) 120 consecutive days prior to the fair for horses and market beef, 60 consecutive days for sheep, swine & goats; 30 consecutive days for breeder & feeder animals and rabbits and poultry. Independent exhibitors <u>must have</u> "onground" supervision by a responsible adult.
- 11. <u>UNIFORMS</u>: All FFA, 4-H & Grange exhibitors of livestock & dairy cattle must wear the established uniform of their organization while showing their animals. Independent exhibitors are required to wear white shirts (long or short sleeves), blue pants, and appropriate footwear (no open toed shoes).
- 12. <u>SENIOR DEPARTMENT RESTRICTIONS</u>: Junior exhibitors and Junior organizations may be allowed to enter exhibits in Senior Department classes for which they are eligible only when: (a) "ALL OTHER" classes are not available, or (b) a class for the exhibit is not provided in the Junior department, or (c) it allows participation in featured breed and/or sponsored association shows. The Junior exhibitor must also exhibit the project in the

- 6. <u>PARKING</u>: Any and all vehicles must be parked and/or contained within the parameter of designated space. Vehicles not parked within camping area must park in camping parking lot.





Project Agreement forms must be completed by each exhibitor intending to show a replacement heifer at the Amador County Fair; All rules & regulations must be adhered to refer to annual Amador County Fair Replacement Heifer Packet.

Heifers must be bred to calve between Sept 1st and Oct 31st of the fair year. Heifers that calve prior to or during the Amador County Fair Beef Replacement Heifer show will be disqualified and ineligible to show or sell through the Beef Replacement Heifer show and sale.

Replacement Heifers will be pregnancy tested on Wednesday of Fair, time and location to be announced at the mandatory exhibitor meeting on Tuesday. At that time, exhibitors will be required to submit a Medication Form with all other required documents.

Amador County Fair Junior Livestock Auction Buyer Policy

- 1. All buyers are required to provide credit card information or guarantee of payment (signed check) prior to receiving a buyer's number. Exceptions must be approved in advance by Amador County Fair Board of Directors or its designee.
- 2. All buyers at the Amador County Junior Livestock Auction (JLA) must have received a buyer's number and provided required contact and payment information prior to purchasing an animal. Any lot sold to a buyer without a buyer's number will be considered a "no sale" and will be sold immediately.
- 3. All buyers are expected to pay for their purchases on the day of the Auction. Cash, Check, Visa, MasterCard, Discover and American Express are accepted forms of payment. An additional fee of \$35 shall be assessed on all insufficient fund checks and/or transaction fees resulting from a declined check or credit card transaction.
- 4. Should the JLA lot not be paid the day of the sale, the payment guarantee will be utilized for any outstanding balances after 30 days of the auction. It is the responsibility of the buyer to ensure all outstanding balances are paid within 30 days of auction.
- 5. At 30 days, any outstanding balances and fees will accrue a twenty (20%) percent penalty, compounded monthly, until the balance is paid in full.
- 6. The Amador County Fair JLA reserves the right to refuse to issue a buyer's number to any potential buyer due to their prior non-payment or poor payment history.

Amador County JLA exhibitors (sellers) will not receive payment until enough monies are received to distribute all exhibitor (seller) checks.
