8:30 am Horsemanship is open to the public and will be held in the Benny Brown Arena. Interview & Test immediately follow horsemanship in the Fair Board Room. Not open to the public.

4 pm Speeches, Modeling and Impromptu Questions & coronation to follow at the Biagi Stage. The public is encouraged to attend.

6 pm Kick-off dinner. Open to the public with the purchase of a dinner ticket. The new 2020 Miss Amador Fair Rodeo Queen will be introduced at the Kick-Off Dinner.

Queen will be crowned and awards presented when the judges have made their decision after the on-stage presentations.

Eligibility

- Contestant must be between the ages of 16 and 25, as of January 1, 2020.
- Must be an Amador County resident, and/or from a contiguous county: Sacramento, San Joaquin, Calaveras, El Dorado.
- Contestant must own or lease a suitable horse for the rodeo and other related horse events, but it need not be the horse used in the competition. No stallions allowed.

Rules and Regulations

- 1. Contestant must submit the following documents in order to compete in the competition. All documents must be signed by parent/guardian (if under 18) and contestant and be properly completed in order to be eligible for consideration.
 - a. Application form
 - b. Agreement to Abide to Rules and Regulations and Waiver of Liability
 - c. Expectation Agreement
- 2. A \$50 entry fee will be required by the contestants by <u>May 22nd</u> and must be turned in at the Fair Office.
- 3. An 8x10 photo required (headshot including hat and western attire, in color).
- 4. Contestants are required to be on time and adhere to the schedule of the competition.
- 5. Upon arrive to the location of the competition, contestants will be responsible to and under the jurisdiction of the Amador County Fair Rodeo Queen Committee.
- 6. Parents, friends, and relatives are welcome to attend all activities designated and must agree to abide by all rules and regulations.
- 7. Final decisions will be that of the judges, including any matter while the contestant is competing.
- 8. Contestants must conduct themselves in a proper, lady-like manner, portray high moral standards, and demonstrate good sportsmanship or they may be disqualified.
- 9. All social media accounts (Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, etc.) MUST be made available to the ACFRQ Committee and will be monitored.
- 10. All contestants are required to dress in full western attire for all events.

- 11. All contestants are not permitted, at any time during the competition or as the reigning queen, to smoke, drink alcoholic beverages, or use any foul language.
- 12. Any problems that arise should be directed to the Amador County Fair Rodeo Queen Committee.
- 13. The perpetual crown and chaps are the permanent property of the Amador County Fair Rodeo Queen committee. You will be liable for any and all damages.
- 14. After the coronation, the contestants and newly crowned queen are expected to remain at the event location and demonstrate good behavior and sportsmanship. It is appropriate for the queen and contestants to show their appreciation for the opportunity to compete by thanking judges, sponsors, Queen Committee members, and other present Association officials for their efforts to support and organize the competition.
- 15. Any misconduct or violations of these Rules and Regulations may be grounds for contestants to be disqualified from the competition.
- 16. Prior to the competition, a contestant must inform the Amador County Fair Rodeo Queen Committee of any queen titles she is currently holding at the any time of the duration of the competition. It is up to the discretion of the Committee if the contestant may be allowed to participate in the contest.

NOTE: These rules and regulations are designed for your safety and to keep the competition running properly and in a professional manner. If any grievances arise, either during or after the queen contest, the matter should be brought to the attention of the Amador County Fair Rodeo Queen Committee.

Agreement to Abide by Rules and Regulations and Waiver of Liability

In consideration of my application having been accepted for participation in the 2020 Miss Amador County Fair Rodeo Queen Competition, I hereby certify that I have read and agree to abide by all Rules and Regulations and understand that any violation of these Rules and Regulations may disqualify me from participation in this contest.

I further agree to hold harmless the Amador County Fair, their officials, agents, and volunteers for any claims resulting in loss accident, or injury received by me in connection with participation by me in any event or performance of this contest.

Please note — approval of the Queen Committee is required if the contestant holds an existing title. You may not run for Miss Amador Scholarship Competition at the same time.

Expectation Agreement

This expectation agreement is between the Amador County Fair Rodeo Queen Committee, here in after referred to as the ACFRQ and
If I am selected QUEEN, I agree to abide by the following expectations during my reign.
 I will send thank you notes to all sponsors, judges, and appropriate officials within 14 days of the date I am crowned. I will promote the ACFR and the sport of rodeo in a positive manner at all times. I will demonstrate honesty, good sportsmanship, good behavior, and etiquette. This includes, but not limited to, use of social media such as Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Snapchat, etc. I will be chaperoned at my events by either a parent, ACFR adult member (adult of 21 years or older), or approved chaperone. I will, at all times, treat animals humanely; if at anytime I mistreat my horse, it may result in the loss of my title. I will have a horse an appropriate tack suitable for use in the Amador County Fair Rodeo Grand Entry and other special events. I will wear my sash, crown, buckle, and proper western attire whenever I make public appearances as QUEEN. I will represent ACFR at many local functions and fundraisers. I am not expected to make appearances during school hours unless approved by my parents. I will keep in close contact with my coordinator(s) and will notify them if I am unable to meet any obligations as QUEEN or if any problems arise. All appearances must be approved by the ACFR Queen Coordinator. Any unapproved appearance may result in the loss of my title. If I am unable to fulfill my duties as QUEEN or if I do not adhere to this Expectations Agreement, I agree to forfeit my title as QUEEN and return all ACFRQ property and all prizes I received.

Judging Categories

- 1. Categories to be judged and points to be used are as follows:
 - a. Horsemanship 400 points
 - i. Contestant will be judged on
 - 1. Control of her mount and the way she handles each situation
 - 2. Appearance (cleanliness and appropriateness) of her horse and equipment
 - 3. Overall understanding and horsemanship skill
 - ii. The contestant will be required to mount, dismount, drop bridle, perform a queen's presentation ride, a flag run, and a predetermined riding pattern.
 - iii. Dress wear for horsemanship: long-sleeved shirt and wrangler jeans, felt cowboy hat, boots (Fat Baby style or crepe sole boots are not permitted due to safety precautions), belt, and buckle. Gloves and chaps are not permitted.
 - iv. No two girls may ride the same horse during this portion of the competition.
 - b. Speech 200 points
 - i. The contestant will prepare a 3-5-minute speech on a topic selected by the Queen Committee.
 - c. Interview 200 points
 - i. Written questions will be reviewed by the Queen Committee
 - ii. Contestants will be judged on
 - 1. Rodeo Knowledge
 - 2. Conversational Ability
 - 3. Projection
 - 4. Posture
 - 5. Eye Contact
 - 6. Professionalism
 - 7. Overall Appearance
 - d. Appearance 100 points
 - i. Fit
 - ii. Appropriate color
 - iii. Knowledge of current western styles
 - iv. Flatters one's body type
 - e. Written Test 50 points
 - i. Contestants will be judged on

- 1. Knowledge of horses
- 2. Tack
- 3. Rodeo
- f. Modeling 25 points
 - i. Confidence
 - ii. Use of stage
 - iii. Projection of one's personality
- g. Impromptu 25 points
 - i. Contestants will be asked questions onstage
- h. Ticket Sales tiebreaker only
- i. Miss Congeniality 0 points
 - i. Voted on by contestants
- j. Photogenic Award 0 points
- k. Sponsorship Award 0 points

Judges will sign score sheets and seal them in an envelope, and be returned to the Queen Coordinator immediately following each category. An independent auditor shall total the scores and they will be given back to the Queen Committee upon crowning. Scores shall be provided to each contestant following the Queen announcement. The judged categories for the Amador County Fair Queen Competition is open to the public, with the exception of test and personal interview.
